Harvest

I wanted to share with you that in Collective Worship this week, we reflected that Jesus gave up everything to save us from sin. That He left the power and glory He had in Heaven to come down to earth so He could lay down His life for us. He taught us to love one another – even our enemies. And He told us to give generously to anyone who asks and to take care of the poor. We were able to reflect in this way, within our focus on the value of kindness that we share, and following how our community/you gave so generously last week for the appeal to support people responding to the vast flooding in Pakistan. Remarkably, from that one day we raised **£380** and we will be sending that through along with the funds raise at Christchurch for the same cause.

I also shared with the children that at St. Luke's the governors made the decision that all of the fundraising that we do here will have a common theme—to seek to reduce the impact of poverty.

Our next such event is aimed at precisely doing that.

Next **Monday 03 October**, the children will all go to church to share our **Harvest Mass** with Father Tom and Mother Tracy.

The demand for foodbanks is increasing all of the time and everything that we collect through our celebration for Harvest is donated to the Food Bank to help our community.

Please bring items into the main Reception and we will make sure they get to church. Non perishable goods are the most helpful. And again, in anticipation of your generosity, thank you.

Update from our Maths Lead—Ms. Williams



We love maths at St Luke's, but we know that it is a big subject that can sometimes feel challenging!

We appreciate there's more to it than times tables and there's more to times tables than learning them off by heart. However, a lot of the rich, interesting maths is all about the multiplicative relationships and these are hard to fully grasp without fluent recall of the tables. For that reason, learning the tables is fundamental – they are a key facilitator to the maths that sits on top. Therefore, we are excited to share that we will continue to use Times Tables Rock Stars for all children in Years 3-6.

This week, your child will have received their log in details, and we would love for them to use it both in school and at home to help them master their times tables.

You can support your child by encouraging them to log into their account and practice at home. We recommend a "little and often" approach; 3 minutes practice a day, 4 or 5 times a week is a good target. Please remind your child not to share their login details.
